



Install energy-efficient Western Window vinyl windows and doors and qualify for the Stimulus Bill Incentive. In order to qualify for the incentive the window or door must meet or exceed the 2009 Stimulus Bill requirements of a U-Value of .30 or lower and a Solar Heat Gain Coefficient of .30 or lower.

Here's How the New Federal Energy Tax Credit Program Works¹

Section 1121 of the stimulus package allows for a federal energy tax credit to homeowners, up to 30% of the cost of window and door replacement (or, a maximum \$1,500 for taxable years 2009 and 2010). To qualify, windows and doors must have a 0.30 U-factor and 0.30 Solar Heat Gain Coefficient (SHGC) or better. Qualifying and receiving your tax credit is easy:

- Purchase a qualifying Western Window vinyl door or window and save your sales receipt and the NFRC/ENERGY STAR label with your tax documents.
- Have your qualifying windows or doors installed between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2010.
- Claim the tax credit associated with your qualifying purchase on your federal filing for the 2009 and/or 2010 tax year.
